SAFETY DRILLS 2023 - 2024

Over the course of the school year, several drills will be carried out to help ensure that students and staff are aware of what must



be done in the event of an emergency. These drills include, but are not limited to, fire, earthquake and lockdown.

Sometimes these drills will be planned, while other times spontaneous drills are held to assess everyone's ability to respond quickly to the emergencies.

In the event of an actual emergency and there is no access to the school building, all students and staff will assemble at the Reunification Point (pick-up location) which is located at the St. Peters Basketball court. The next Earthquake drill will be carried out during the week of October 23rd.

Please note that there will be an island-wide Earthquake drill that will be conducted on November 1st in all schools.

1. Welcome the emotion - Children experience big emotions; don't let your child's anger trigger you, and welcome the tears and fears that always hide behind the anger.

2. Listen and Empathize - use more phrases such as "Wow! ... I see ... Really? ... How was that for you? ... Tell me more.

3. Slow down and savor the moment

4. Bed Time Snuggle and Chat
