### Parental Encouragement Tips

According to "De Montfort University" there are many different ways parents can express encouragement, including:

Catch your child doing something good.

Look out for when they do something good and say so. "You are sharing your toys with your sister. That is really kind!"

• Describe the good behavior.

Describing what it is that you like is called 'descriptive praise'.

Make the encouragement relevant.

Praise needs to be appropriate to the child being praised.

Look for little changes and successes.

Don't wait until your child had done something perfectly to praise them.
